Illinois Tollway – Key Statistics

MOVE

- □ 286-mile system comprised of four tollways
- □ Opened in 1958 as a bypass around Chicago to connect Indiana and Wisconsin
- □ Carries more than1.4 million vehiclesper day
- ☐ User-fee system
 - No state or federal gas tax dollars used for maintenance and operations



Pollinator Habitat Program

- Inventory
 - Existing and planned
- Coordination and Outreach
 - Roadway Maintenance
 - Map Art
- Habitat establishment
 - Modify and develop seed mixes for design and construction
 - Provide oversight during construction
- Maintenance and Monitoring
 - Implement developed maintenance protocols
 - Monitor habitat establishment





Inventory

- Inventoried existing planted habitat sites to date
 - 900 acres within Tollway ROW and mitigation sites
- Inventoried planned habitat sites by the end of MOVE IL, (area added since Board support of Program)
 - □ 331 acres within Tollway ROW and mitigation sites

Coordination

- Working with Rights-of Way as HabitatWorking Group
- Tollway funded ~\$1.5 billion in professional services and construction contracts in 2015
- Tollway Environmental & Maintenance are developing targeted vegetated management areas (TVMA) for specialized management practices to occur in potential habitat areas





Outreach

■ Map Cover Art Contest

- ☐ Focus on Monarch and ROW as habitat
- 75 + entries from high school students around the region
- 27,000 votes





Habitat Establishment

- 18 acres of new habitat and ~16,300 milkweed and other pollinator vegetative plugs to be established this year, as part of active construction contracts, at no additional cost to the Tollway
- Working to establish pollinator specific areas throughout the Tollway system as part the Move IL Program and Tollway Systemwide projects.





Maintenance & Monitoring

- Continue efforts with Tollway Maintenance on TVMAs
 - ☐ TVMA pilot area north of Grand Avenue and I-94, within M-4 section
- ☐ Illinois Natural History
 Survey and consulting
 staff to assist in
 monitoring habitat
 establishment
