
Oil & Gas Rights-of-Way: a Route for Recovery

Rights-Of-Way in Texas

RRC: 466,623 miles of pipelines TXDOT: 79,000 miles of roads 10,384 miles of railway ERCOT: 38,000 miles of transmission lines ~594,007 miles

594,007 miles x ~200 ft (.038 mile) = 22,500 sq. miles or **14.4 M acres**

- Seed oil & gas downsized pad sites and pipeline ROW native habitat for the monarch butterfly and other wildlife species
- Develop SOPs for native habitat restoration
- Summarize and share with Industry
- Encourage Industry-wide implementation
