BREAKOUT SESSION 2

State of the Science Auditorium

This session will introduce several research topics informing monarch and pollinator conservation. Each presentation will discuss their approaches and findings with time for discussion. Attendees will come away with a better understanding of current scientific research and applications for their conservation approaches.

Partnering with Federal Agencies for Pollinator Conservation

Community Conservation Workshop Library

BREAKOUT SESSION 3

Pollinator Plantings in Agricultural Working Lands Auditorium
