


OKLAHOMA CITY

- Oklahomans can take action to help monarchs by planting monarch gardens
- Increase knowledge, teacher capacity, nature connection, and habitat for monarchs in OKC
- Numbers:
 - 7th year of the program
 - 27 schools
 - Serve 13,000+ students annually in OKC
 - 703 meters² of habitat created
 - 800+ stems of milkweed

Program Evaluation



- Three different target groups
 - Teachers
 - Students
 - Pollinators
- Prelim data is positive across all three groups
- Tracks longevity of gardens





How well prepared do you feel to choose appropriate plants for a pollinator garden? (+1.17) Increase in variety of plants (1.45 ± 0.16)

Increase in number of and types of insects (1.33 ± 0.22) Butterflies 34 species Hoverflies 11 species Small bees 8 genera Large bees 5 species Wasps 10 species

What's next?



- 2024 application period has opened (5-6 schools will be awarded)
- Introduction of a maintenance grant to help established gardens, 5 schools awarded in 2023
- Post-garden survey to evaluate longterm impacts
- Continued insect surveys this summer
